## Billericay Town Football Club

Billericay Town Football Club was formed in 1880 making it the 11th oldest club in Essex. It moved into the Romford & District League in 1890 competing in this league until 1914.

Billericay Town became the first [and so far the only] club to win the F.A.Vase for a third time in 1979 when they defeated Almondsbury Greenway 4-1. This match was notable for a hat-trick by Doug Young - the first hat-trick in a Cup Final at Wembley Stadium since Geoff Hurst's in the 1966 World Cup Final. The club now play in the Ryman League Premier Division

### **Banks and Taylor**, Shefford, Bedfordshire

**Dragonslayer** 4.5% - A straw coloured beer, dry, malty and lightly hopped

**Golden Fox** 4.1% - Golden refreshing beer with fruity overtones.

### **Brentwood**, Brentwood, Essex

**Chockwork Orange** 6.5% - A deep chocolate malted beer brewed with oranges to give it that extra pazazz and matured to provide a classic "old ale" style beer.

**Forbidden Fruit** 4.2% - A light Golden beer with summer fruits and Galena hops a lovely summer's evening thirst quencher.

**Heavenly Body** 4.3% - A blonde fruity number, light on the pallet with plenty of aromas and flavour coming through from Cascade hops..... 'Heavenly' some might say!

**Hope and Glory** 4.5% - A darker and more full bodied bitter but with the lightness of the hops coming out in the flavour and leaving a pleasant end note.

**Lumberjack** 5.2% - A strong, sweetish full bodied bitter. Made using traditional English Fuddles and EKG hops to give a rounded hoppy finish.

**Playing Away** 3.8% - Brewed specially to celebrate the World Cup this beer is a traditional quaffable bitter to continue to enjoy throughout the tournament.

### **Burton Bridge**, Burton-on-Trent, Staffordshire

**Damson Porter** 4.5% - Very dark brown but not black, fruity beer with a distinctive bitter-sweet after palate, the addition of Damson juice smoothes out the bitterness and adds a little sweetness

**Golden Delicious** 3.8% - Pale straw in colour with a dry bitter finish.

### **Crouch Vale**, South Woodham Ferrers, Essex

**Brewers Gold** 4.0% - This is a pale, refreshing and hoppy beer with gorgeous aromas of tropical fruits.

### **Dark Star**, Horsham, West Sussex

**Original** 5.0 % - A dark and strong bitter beer that defies classification. It has a complex malt flavour with a hint of burnt grain from the mixture of Crystal and Chocolate grist

**Sunburst** 4.8 % - A hint of initial sweetness adds to the fruitness of this summer ale without detracting from it's clean flavour and rich hop aroma

### **Farmers**, Maldon, Essex

**Golden Boar** 5.0% - An amber beer with a tremendous aroma that will knock you socks off. It uses an obscene amount of Cascade Hops to get the aroma.

**Pucks Folly** 4.3 % - A golden beer to rival any other on the bar. Light and refreshing with a citrus (some say grapefruit!) note.

### **Goffs**, Winchcombe, Gloucestershire

**Guinevere** 4.1% - A lighter style traditional ale, balanced bitterness and a slight spicyness to the character.

**Jouster** 4.0% - A drinkable, tawny coloured ale, with a light hoppiness in the aroma. It has a good balance of malt and bitterness in the mouth, underscored by fruitiness, with a clean, hoppy aftertaste.

### **Grainstore**, Oakham, Rutland

**Rutland Panther** 3.4% - A refreshing well balanced dark mild, whose chocolate and fruity flavours compliment its roasted long bitter finish.

### **Green Jack**, Lowestoft, Suffolk

**Orange Wheat** 4.2% - A delightfully drinkable Wheat Beer. Light, with grainy citrus & marmalade flavours. .

**Ripper** 8.5% - A champion Barley Wine. Inspired by Belgian tripel ales this multi-awarding winning brew is dangerously drinkable. Rich amber in colour Ripper is sweet and fruity with a warming finish.

### **Jarrow**, Jarrow, Tyne and Wear

**Joblings Swinging Gibbet** 4.1% - A copper coloured, evenly balanced beer with a good hop aroma and fruity finish.

**McConnell's Irish Stout** 4.6% - A rich, creamy stout with a long lingering liquorice and pale chocolate finish.

### **Mauldons**, Sudbury, Suffolk

**Pickwick** 4.2% - A best bitter with a rich rounded malt flavour with ripe aromas of hops and fruit. A bitter sweet finish.

**Silver Adder** 4.2% - A light coloured bitter with fine hop and malt combinations giving a refreshing crisp taste.

### **Milestone**, Newark, Nottinghamshire

**Lions Pride** 3.8% - A Copper coloured Session Ale. Well balanced Light & refreshing. Bitter with a hint of Lemon.

**Olde Home Wrecker** 4.9% - Full bodied winter warmer with a pleasing nutty finish.

### **Milton**, Milton, Cambridgeshire

**Medusa** 4.6% - No tasting notes - A Ruby Mild ?

**Tiki** 3.8% - Fruity golden ale, with a pronounced apricot chaacter and a lasting bitter finish.

### **Nelson**, Chatham, Kent

**Spanker** 4.2% - Fruity ale with predominance of hops giving a refreshing feel to the palate.

**Vengeance** 4.8% - A popular lager coloured bitter with a sweet and hoppy aftertaste.

### **Nethergate**, Sudbury, Suffolk

**Old Growler** 5.0% - A complex, satisfying porter, smooth and distinctive. Roast malt and fruit feature in the palate. The finish is powerfully hoppy with a hint of liquorice.

**Umbel Ale** 3.9% - Freshly toasted coriander seeds are added to the grist and at the later stages of the boil, resulting in a festival of flavour and aroma, a real thirst quencher.

### **RCH**, Weston Super Mare, Somerset

**East Street Cream** 5.0% - This enigmatic full bodied beer with malty hoppy fruit bitter with a sweet taste which all vie for dominance in this complex and well crafted premium chestnut coloured ale.

**Pitchfork** 4.3% - A golden bitter with floral citric hop aroma. It has a hoppy predominate taste which is slightly sweet and fruity and leaves you wanting more.

### **Whitstable**, Whitstable, Kent

**Raspberry Wheat** 5.2% - Deep red in colour, a naturally cloudy wheat beer with refreshing raspberry fruit on a sharp finish.

**Winkle Picker** 4.5% - An amber-coloured best bitter with an orange pomander aroma and a smooth, predominantly malty flavour.

### **Wibblers**, Mayland, Essex

**Spirit of '66** 4.3% - Love it or hate it there's no getting away from the World Cup. Full flavoured and smooth to the taste.

**The Apprentice** 3.9% - Golden in colour, hoppy nose and definitely a session beer.
